Commented [HM2]: Cover letters and letters of interest should always contain the date listed above the address of the institution (including name of program/hiring director when available). If name of program director is not available, use "Program Director." This letter should also contain an address for the organization.

Commented [HM3]: Use a specific address otherwise "program director."

Commented [HM4]: You will want to begin your letter with the specific name of the organization followed by your interest in the program.

Commented [HM5]: Your body paragraphs will outline the qualifications, experiences, and strengths that make you a valuable addition to the program. It is particularly useful to think about the ways in which your qualifications/strengths and values align with those of the program. Be specific about the elements of the program.

Commented [HRM6]: Body paragraphs should begin with a strong topic sentence that makes a connection between the candidate and the program's elements, needs, and/or values.

Commented [HRM7]: This is a good example of naming something that is specific to the program.

Commented [HM8]: Just as in the comment above, it is important to include specific aspects of the program that you are interested in pursuing. Focus on the things that set the program apart from others.

Commented [HM9]: This is one way that you may relate to the program. You can also use the TsarC model to help you formulate and organize body paragraphs. Remember that the C in TsarC stands for connection to your future goals. It is important to then also connect that to the program specifically.

Commented [HRM10]: Your concluding paragraph should thank the organization for their consideration. You can also express interest in an interview (if applicable) and/or invite them to look further into your application/other materials such as CV.
