COURSE DETAILS

Course Description:

This course provides students with initial exposure to their surgery clerkship on the RVU campus at the surgical simulation center for one week. Students will be expected to take call in the evenings.

Prerequisites: Successful completion of all pre-clinical (Year 1 and Year 2) coursework and passing score on COMLEX 1. The course emphasizes acquiring competency in the following skills;

- Acquiring a history and performing a performing a simulated physical examination on patients
 presenting in an emergency department with surgical disease or in post-operative hospital setting.
- Assessing patient problems, creating a cogent differential diagnosis, ordering and interpreting
 appropriate laboratory and diagnostic tests, distinguishing surgical from non-surgical problems
 and distinguishing emergent, urgent, and elective surgical problems.
- 3. Develop the ability to accurately report a patient summary to fellow students and faculty
- 4. Identification of common surgical instruments
- 5. Acquisition of knowledge about peri-operative conditions and management of those conditions

Final Grade Calculation:

Grades for the Fundamentals of Surgery course are determined by performance on the Instrument Identification Post-test, Clinical Knowledge Final Examination and Instructors' Evaluation. Transcript designations for the core rotations include:

- H: Honors
- P: Pass
- F: Fail
- Px: Pass with Remediation

For the **final course grade**:

- Honors = 12-15 points, (80% or greater)
- Pass = 5-11 points,
- Fail < 5 points

If a student fails this course, successful passing of the surgical clerkship is considered successful remediation. If a student fails both the Fundamentals of Surgery course and the surgical clerkship, the Fundamentals of Surgery course must be repeated successfully for remediation.

Course Policies:

Attendance

100% attendance is required at all times during the course. Students are expected to obtain Excused Absences in advance, except in the case of an emergency. Any student who misses a required event without approval will receive a zero for that session and will not be allowed to remediate the session or event.

Professional Conduct Policy

Students are expected to always adhere to the highest level of professional conduct. Students will always treat *all* employees of Rocky Vista University and those in clinical training sites with respect and courtesy. Students will demonstrate ethically responsible behavior; act honestly and with integrity to patients, their representatives, faculty/preceptors, and coworkers. Students will preserve confidentiality and not discuss patients publicly or with unauthorized persons. No documents with patient-identifying information will leave the clinical setting. Compliance with all institutional regulations, including state and federal HIPAA laws, is expected.

The Preceptor has the authority to dismiss a student from the clerkship for violations of the student's duties and responsibilities as delineated in this manual, a threat to public health or safety, or as deemed appropriate for the continued operation of the clinical site. Any such action will result in evaluation by the Department of Clinical Education and the Student Progress Committee, which may result in a failing grade for the clerkship and/or dismissal from the University. In addition, any problems or concerns affecting students not adequately resolved at the site should be referred to the Department of Clinical Education and the appropriate Dean of Clinical Education. Students should read and comply with the Student Level of Supervision available in the Clinical Education Manual. In the case of any student suspected of having a substance abuse or mental health problem, the Preceptor must report this situation to both the Dean and Senior Associate Dean of Clinical Education to direct the student to evaluation assistance and further action.
