
UPDATES FROM THE VICE PRESIDENT JESÚS TREVIÑO, PHD

To promote community and greater understanding of DEI issues, the Office for Diversity, Equity and Inclusion is launching its inaugural Intergroup Dialogue Program, "Voices of Discovery" this month. The audience of the pilot initiative is RVU staff in Colorado with a goal to expand the program to faculty and students on all three campuses. Participants will meet for four consecutive weeks starting September 14 for hour-long sessions facilitated by two trained staff members to discuss issues of race in America.

The project is in response to the results of the campus climate survey which suggests that community-building activities are needed to counter feelings of discrimination and disparate treatment by some members of the community.

These small group dialogues will provide a safe place for the thoughtful examination of matters involving diversity, equity, and inclusion.
