Due to One Big Beautiful Bill changes, students that return from a leave of absence in OMS II, III, or IV will have their Loan Fees adjusted accordingly per new limits.

<sup>3</sup> The Cost of Attendance varies by year in school and is updated annually. Modifications, although unlikely, could occur at any time and students would be notified.

The Cost of Attendance (COA) is an estimate of the cost of attending RVU and maintaining a modest but adequate standard of living. Your individual budget may be higher or lower. Books and supplies cost includes for OMS I: \$35 iClicker, \$300 OMM table, \$40 suture kit; OMS II includes: \$35 iClicker and \$40 suture kit. Also, included in OMS II & III is an additional \$1,000 for board prep material. The COA does not include living expenses for a student's spouse or other dependents. Total loan amounts borrowed, and scholarships awarded cannot exceed the COA minus any other aid received. Students are strongly encouraged to complete a personal budget and only borrow the minimum amount needed to cover their actual costs. Many RVUCOM students are able to live on less than the COA by budgeting carefully and reducing their expenses for food and housing, personal and transportation costs.
